Dear Sir:

Attorney General Medlock has referred your letter to me for reply.

This is also to confirm our telephone conversation of Friday, July 22, 1983, concerning your inquiry. You had requested information on Section 23-23-80, Code of Laws of South Carolina (1976). That Section had exempted municipalities with populations of less than two thousand five hundred from the law enforcement training requirements of Chapter 23, Title 23, of the Code of Laws of South Carolina.

Section 23-23-80 was repealed in 1978. The same legislation that repealed that Section also provided that, in a situation where a municipality employed only one law enforcement officer, and he was attending training at the Criminal Justice Academy, the Sheriff of the county would be required to provide law enforcement for the municipality. You informed me that you had obtained updated supplements to the Code of Laws containing the above information.
