Dear Mr. Runey:

Your letter of March 25, 1977, requests my opinion on the merit and constitutionality of House Bill 2134. This bill would require that any custodian of a public building offer the Commission for the Blind an option to set up a blind person in a vending facility within the building prior to contracting with private parties for such facilities and restricts competition within the same building from other concessionaires.

The enclosed memorandum directed to me from Harry B. Burchstead, Jr., Assistant Attorney General, dated April 5, 1977, shows the background for this bill.

It is my opinion that the bill is meritorious and that no constitutional objection appears thereto.
