Dear Mr. Lipsey:

You have requested an opinion as to the validity of the Town of Jonesville ordinance of January 11, 1977, which increased the punishment for any violation of the town code from one hundred to two hundred dollars. In my opinion, the town ordinance is consistent with the applicable state law, specifically § 5-7-30, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976.

I do not know what changes, if any, the General Assembly is considering to make to the law on this subject. However, under the existing law, the town ordinance is completely valid.
