Dear Mr. Bradley:

In response to your inquiry as to the status of a corporation's Legal Defense Fund, I have checked with the Secretary of State's Office and they have informed me that for such Fund to become a domestic corporation maintaining its office in our State, it must file its articles of incorporation after dissolving itself of its non-profit tax exempt status. Only then can it become a domestic corporation within our State. As to your question of whether such an organization would be held to be practicing law in this State if it originated or otherwise participated in litigation, I am enclosing a copy of Section 56-141 and Section 56-142 of the 1962 South Carolina Code.
