Dear Representative Evatt:

Attorney General Daniel R. McLeod has referred your letter of April 30, 1975, to me for reply inasmuch as I have done a considerable amount of work for the South Carolina Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission.

As you have indicated, there is no authorization for the Commission to issue a sale and consumption license to business establishments which operate only as bowling lanes. The Commission can issue such licenses to businesses 'bona fide engaged primarily and substantially in the preparation and serving of meals or furnishing of lodging.' Section 4-29(4) (a). The Commission has advised me that it is considering the application as one for a restaurant to be located on part of the premises. It will be a factual question for their determination as to whether or not the proposed location meets the statutory prerequisites. A hearing on this application is going to be held in the near future and I suggest that you contact the Commission directly to find out the time and place.
