Dear Mr. Collins:

You have asked for an opinion as to the legal status of the Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Marlboro and Chesterfield Counties with reference to social security coverage for the employees and whether it meets the requirements under Act No. 602, Acts and Joint Resolutions of South Carolina, 1954, Section 61-221(b).

The Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Marlboro and Chesterfield Counties was created by Act No. 730, 1973, of the General Assembly. The members of the Commission are appointed by the legislative delegations of the two counties and are vested with the power to expend State and Federal funds and enter into agreements for Federal and State grants.

On the basis of the foregoing, it is the opinion of this Office that the Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Marlboro and Chesterfield Counties is a 'political subdivision' of the State within the meaning of Section 61-221(b).
