Dear Mr. Johnson:

You have inquired as to how certain residents in your area can secede from a special purpose district.

Under provisions of § 59-599.91 et seq. of the CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, the county boards of the several counties of the State are authorized to enlarge, diminish or consolidate any existing special purpose districts located within such county. These provisions detail the procedure for changing district boundaries.

I am aware of no means by which residents can secede from a special purpose district other than by alteration of district boundaries by the appropriate county authorities.
