Dear Mr. Chappell:

Mr. Cheek has referred to me your letter of July 31, 1975, inquiring as to the right of a student to attend school in Sumter County when he resides in another county, but his family owns property in Sumter County. As Section 21-751.1, Code of Laws of South Carolina, specifically states, the child himself must own the real estate in the school district—not the child's parents. Under the facts related in your letter, it appears that the child in question does not qualify for free tuition.
