Dear Miss Peeples:

At the Board meeting on September 11, 1974, I was given certain correspondence from Mr. Joe B. Bogan, Controller for Beaufort County Memorial Hospital, which contained a job description for a maternal-child health family planning practitioner. It is my understanding that Beaufort County Memorial Hospital wishes to hire one Brenda Joyce Jones to serve as a maternal-child health family planning practitioner and the question is whether these job responsibilities necessitate licensure as a registered nurse under the South Carolina Nurse Practice Act.

Having reviewed the job description furnished by Mr. Bogan, together with Section 56-951, S. C. Code of Laws, as amended, defining the practice of nursing, I advise that a maternal-child health family planning practitioner is required by law to be licensed by the State Board of Nursing in order to lawfully practice that nursing specialty in this State.
