Dear Mr. Guthrie:

By letter of September 13, 1974, you have inquired as to the status of yourself and the members of your family regarding the prospective payment of in-state tuition rates at state supported universities.

I enclose for your information a copy of Section 22-32.2, S. C. Code of Laws, as amended, which is applicable to your question. From the facts you state in your letter, it would appear quite likely that your children would be eligible for resident tuition rates. However, this is a question which must be decided based on all facts and final decisions rests with the office of admissions of whatever school you or your children might apply to. I would suggest that you contact the office of admissions of the college concerned at your earliest convenience, and if there is some question regarding the interpretation given to this stated law by the college, you may feel free to contact this office again.

Additionally, I enclose for your information a copy of Section 22-2.1, S. C. Code of Laws, as amended, which would be applicable in your case should you transfer to a military station within this state.
